Tone of the Carborundum Company in response to his article in Industrial and Engineering Chemistry on the silicon carbide modification network. In the meantime, confirmation of the auction proceeds has arrived. Many thanks again!

I recently went to Detroit with Lore M. for an evening social gathering that a friendly group for newcomers usually hosts. Among other things, I met a Dr. Stein who was familiar with your work as a colloid chemist! In addition, Dr. Hein, the director of a pharmaceutical factory, knew Professor Haber. The president of the club, who also knows Dr. Helfman well, spoke to me for a long time and was very charming.
