Dear Marianne and Victor,

After my affidavit for Father was submitted to the consul this afternoon, it occurred to me to make one available to you both just in case. In my first letter to you today, I shared with you my fears of a misunderstanding with Warburg. Maybe, or rather hopefully, I'm mistaken. However, if you find it necessary [and tactically appropriate with regards to the Consul], you can now have this second affidavit at your disposal too.

It's getting very late. I still must take the letter to the post office, and I don't have anything else to add to my first letter today, which was sent to Father's address.

The two copies enclosed with this letter to the consul should be presented to him. The third copy, which is notarized, is also enclosed here. It is only for your reference you can keep it.
