Dear Dr. Bredig,

I am glad that Werner Hochwald sent you the \$40. I would also like to thank you for all your efforts.

In the meantime, the matter in Washington has been settled and I will travel there. The director of the St. Paul Refugee Committee believes

it is necessary that either I or Hochwald's brother appear as a witness. A local lawyer, who personally knows the Director of the Interdepartmental Committee responsible for the cases, told me the same thing.

I also asked to arrange a meeting with an attorney at the National Refugee Service before

the hearing so that I can learn a little bit about the process.

I am not sure to what extent Hochwald's patent cases could influence the hearing favorably or unfavorably. Do you know anything about it? In any case, I would be very grateful if you could arrange for me to receive a brief report from Mr. Holske in the next few days,

including information on whether Hochwald has other registered patents here.

I would then like to discuss with a lawyer whether I should submit the report, refer to it, or not mention it at all.
