Dear Father,

Yesterday, I forgot to ask if you might know a young chemist who works in a Jewish company with synthetic resins and could arrange manufacturing in the future? I was asked if I knew such a chemist without finding out more about the company, which is located here in Berlin. It would not be a permanent position, but rather free-lance (200.-, maybe 250.- at the beginning) with an eventual share of the turnover.

Today Dr. Dannenberg, an acquaintance of mine and Mr. Schnell from Dessau, will visit me. He was in London for two weeks with Mr. Freundlich and Mr. Demuth. He did not have any positive impressions! Otherwise, there is nothing new to share. Warm regards.
